MAYA PRODUCTIONS

Maya Productions makes diverse theatre, arts and heritage projects that create change, bringing together organisations and individuals who passionately want their work to enable racial justice and social change. We create opportunities for people of all ages, abilities, cultures and classes to access enriching creative experiences. We make and tour theatre led by global majority artists (African, South Asian, and Latin American Diasporas), we engage with young people and underrepresented communities through participatory arts projects, and we promote workforce diversity in the creative sector through training, research and mentoring.

Maya Productions is collaborating with [darts – Doncaster's Creative Health and Learning Charity](#) – to offer paid participatory traineeships for emerging and early career global majority artists.

THE OPPORTUNITY

We are recruiting two paid Participatory Artist Trainees who are at an early stage in their career or wish to expand their experience of using their artform to deliver participatory activities that impact positively on people's life, learning and health. This is an incredible opportunity to learn, practice and develop alongside highly experienced artists.

We encourage artists of any age (above 18) to apply, as long as you are early on in your journey as a participatory arts practitioner. You may be a recent creative graduate, or an experienced artist who has never delivered workshops with others. You may be a singer who wants to develop their expertise in leading a community choir, or a musician who wants to understand how to use their artform with adults with lived experience of mental ill health.

Our focus for these traineeships is artists whose artforms are movement, dance, theatre or music (singing, digital, percussion, instrumental etc.)

You could be an interdisciplinary artist who works across more than one artform.

Please note that a large proportion of the projects for adults that are running during the time period for this traineeship are movement based, but this does not mean you need to be a movement artist to take part.

A key aspect of this project is to develop the skills and career progression of global majority participatory arts practitioners in the field of Creative Health and Learning.

This call out is targeted at participatory artists who self-identify as a global majority background artist and who are local to South Yorkshire.

This programme has been made possible with funding from Yorkshire Policy Innovation Partnership's Communities Innovating Yorkshire Fund.

THE TRAINEESHIP

Each successful Trainee will receive:

- 24 days training paid at £75 a day over a 3 month period (includes planning and delivery)
- One to one mentoring and support from a highly experienced participatory artist.
- One to one coaching from a highly experienced Artistic Director.
- One to one mentoring from Industry Professionals relevant to your artform and ambitions.
- The opportunity to shadow and experience a wide range of creative health and learning sessions with all ages, in a range of Doncaster settings.
- The opportunity to co-deliver and collaborate with experienced participatory artists with different artforms.
- The opportunity to lead elements of sessions within the creative health and learning offer.
- Reflection – keeping a journal throughout (in whatever medium) and taking part in reflective conversations.
- Group CPD, learning and discussion opportunities with fellow trainees and experienced artists and facilitators.
- Support to develop and grow within a supported, stimulating and professional environment.
- The opportunity to be connected with a wide range of professional creative, cultural and heritage organisations across South Yorkshire and beyond.
- Ideally your working pattern will be **2 days per week, including Monday** but this will be agreed with each trainee and we aim to work around your availability.
